February 13 Matthew 27:32-66

In the minds of the Jewish leaders, being crucified invalidated which of the claims of Jesus?-<u>"I am the Son of</u> <u>God." This is why they asked for his death and they felt</u> <u>this kind of death proved he wasn't the Son of God.</u> Who saw the same evidence as the Jewish leaders, but came to the opposite conclusion?-<u>the centurion</u>

February 14 Matthew 28:1-20

What is the goal of the Great Commission?-<u>to raise up a</u> significant number of disciples of Jesus in every peoplegroup on earth.

How long will this task take?-<u>until the end of this period of history before Jesus returns.</u>

Mark 1:1-28

What was Jesus teaching his followers to do?-to fish for men, that is, to win and lead people

What two ways did Jesus show his authority?-<u>He gave</u> <u>new teaching based on his own authority; He had</u> <u>authority over the evil spirits.</u>

February 16 Mark 1:29-2:12

How did Jesus get in trouble with the minds of the Jewish leaders?-<u>He announced that he was forgiving a man's</u> <u>sins and only God can forgive sins. If Jesus is not God,</u> <u>then he was blaspheming.</u> What other evidence of the diety of Jesus can be seen in this incident?-<u>He knew their thoughts; he</u> <u>healed the paralytic.</u>

February 17 Mark 2:13-3:6

What four things did Jesus do in this reading that surprised people?-<u>He spent time with people who had the</u> <u>reputation of being sinful; He did not teach fasting; He</u> <u>broke some Sabbath regulations; He healed a man on the</u> <u>Sabbath right in front of his enemies.</u>

February 18 Mark 3:7-30

We see Jesus at a peak of popularity here. What does He do?-<u>He spreads his responsibility and authority to</u> those He is training and then He goes home. He does not try to capitalize on his popular momentum.

What does his family do?-Out of confusion and embarrassment, they treat Him as crazy.

What do his enemies do?-Out of jealousy they attack Him with slander that He is empowered by Satan

February 19 Mark 3:31-4:25

What is the key word (most repeated) in today's reading?-<u>The key word is "word." It occurs at least 8 times and is</u> <u>the central idea. It refers to the message about who</u> <u>Jesus is and what He has done.</u>

Why is it important?-It is important because the whole kingdom of God hinges on the different responses people have to the word. A good response, although it is only found in a minority of people, leads to great multiplication, just as seed does on a farm.
