WEEK SEVEN ANSWERS

February 7 **Exodus 26:1-27:21**

Some items were to be made to exact specifications and other items were not given exact measurements. Why? -God's holiness makes some clear, rigid requirements. Things not specified (like ash buckets) must be based on those that are, using our best judgment.

February 8 **Exodus 28:1-43**

Why does the high priest wear twelve gemstones? -They stand for the twelve tribes of Israel, whom he represents before God, just like Christ represents us before God.

What words are on the front of his turban? -"Holy to the LORD" He is set apart for Yahweh's use.

February 9 **Exodus 29:1-30:10**

Placing hands on the head of the sacrifice shows the transferring of sin's guilt to the animal. As our high priest, does Jesus do this? -No. Jesus had no sin of His own.

What two ceremonies did God command to be done every morning and evening? -sacrifice a year old lamb on the bronze altar and burn incense on the incense altar. This became a time and place God's people met with Him and prayed.

February 10 **Exodus 30:11-31:18**

When God gives us commands, does He also give us the ability to obey? -Yes, through the Holy Spirit, Bezalel and Oholiab could make everything commanded.

February 11 **Exodus 32:1-33:23**

What steps led the Israelites into idolatry? -They got impatient waiting for Moses to come back from God. They substituted Aaron as leader. Aaron did what was popular, making an idol and organizing a festival, billing it "Yahweh's Festival."

What arguments did Moses present to turn God from destroying Israel? -God's reputation with the Egyptians would suffer. God's covenantal promises to the patriarchs were just coming to fruition.

For what did Moses earnestly seek before continuing his mission? -the assurance of the presence of God

February 12 **Exodus 34:1-35:9**

How might an Israelite at Mount Sinai have understood the special declaration of Yahweh about Himself? -God is true to His promises to Abraham and lavishes His love, mercy and forgiveness on those who walk in that faith to a thousand generations, bringing those promises to fulfillment. Those who turn away from Yahweh can expect to bring a curse on themselves and their posterity.

Why were the children of Israel not to mix with the people of the land? -It would lead to spiritual adultery: idolatry.

February 13 **Exodus 35:10-36:38**

Were the people forced to give to build the Tabernacle? -No. They gave freely, from the heart and gave so much they had to be turned away.

What experience might have so inclined them? -God's mercy and grace after their idolatry
