The big task to complete this month was the fully updated Prayer Force folder, which Esther prepared very well off the Prayer Page of our website, which was a first.

Thomas Roy's May work report

Thomas logged 202 hours for BMW. 20 hours teaching online with 2 disciples in Canada who show growth and we will visit at end of July. 25 hours studying the Bible Training Center for Pastors material to teach BMW staff. 103 hours directly teaching our Bangladesh staff. 24 hours translating and preparing materials in Bangla for our BD ministry. 18 hours in the Navigators Discipleship study. 12 hours in teamwork (fundraising, mailing, prayer mtg).

Matthew's May work report

Matthew logged 231 hours for BMW for 20 work days (he took 2 vacation days) for an average work day of 11 and a half hours. He conducted mini camps in Banskhali, Jessore, Khulna and Barishal as well as field visits in Bagerhat and Gopalganj. He is doing well at grooming Satish as a big area coordinator.

The proposal for the 2020 USA Team Bangladesh Visit

The end of May student registration count shows consistent growth again this year. We anticipate getting close to the goal of 3550 by the end of June.

What this means is that we are going to need 13 graduations next year. This year we did 7 and got them all done in four weeks by doing two on three of the weekends. The goal is to get all graduations done in January because attendance is best then. The only way to do this is to develop teams to divide and conquer. In Matthew's words, "If we don't develop teams we will be in trouble."

These teams ideally should have people experienced in visiting Bangladesh, have board experience, and represent our churches and supporters.

In order to develop these teams, I need to have time to recruit them and train them. I want to get their commitment to come and have three meetings before departure to make sure they are prepared to meet all our expectations, experience our ministry and contribute to our ministry.

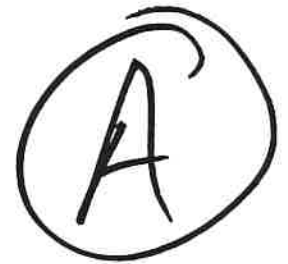
This is not only for this year, but for future years as well, if we continue to grow in a similar manner. We need to develop a pool of people who understand, support and believe in this ministry who can facilitate the graduation season. The goal will be to have these people serve as ambassadors for BMW the rest of the year. It won't happen all the time, but we view the Bangladesh visit as way more than voluntourism. If we have 30 graduations two years from now, we will need 5 teams who stay 3 weekends or 7 teams who can stay 2 weekends.

From the USA side each team should have one Bangladesh-experienced member and one inexperienced member who could be a team leader in the future. In country, each team needs to have a capable Bangladesh staff member and adequate translation ability to handle the USA team.

Matthew and I have been talking about the 2020 graduations for three months already. We conceive of three teams that stay for two weekends to cover 11-12 graduations as the table below suggests.

Here is suggested wording for board action: Bruce moved and Joe seconded to approve the organization of three teams to attend, ~~solemnize~~ and celebrate graduation programs for BMW in January 2020. Dave DeCook, Thomas Roy and Bill Wolf shall have their expenses covered by BMW with a budget of \$27,500. An additional three to six individuals shall be recruited to round out the teams. These individuals will be responsible to pay for all their expenses (tickets, travel insurance, visas, in-country costs), shall comply with all requirements (training, signing indemnification paper, etc.) and shall be approved by the board as a representative of BMW for this mission trip before leaving. Final approval or cancellation of this plan will be made by this board on or before October 30, 2019.
